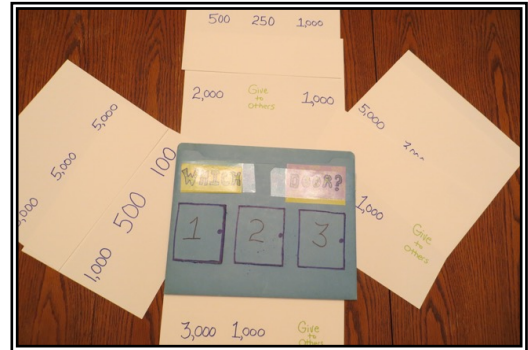


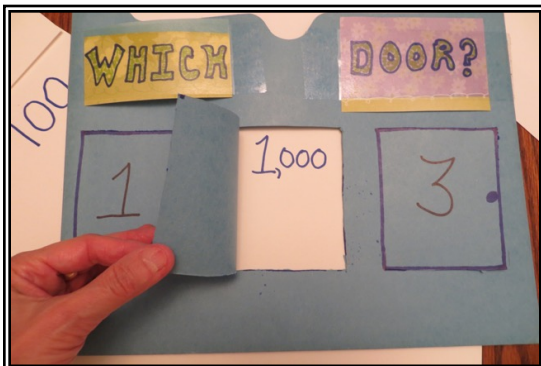
## **Which Door?** *A review game with an unexpected twist*

Use a pocket file folder to hold cards with point values on them in three places. They are placed behind the doors so when the door opens, the points are revealed.



The kids get the idea quickly. Two teams. Answer a review question. Get it right. Pick a door for winning points.

One catch. When the teacher opens the door chosen by the student and it says: “Give to Others,” if that child’s team has any accumulated points, they must give their points to the other team.

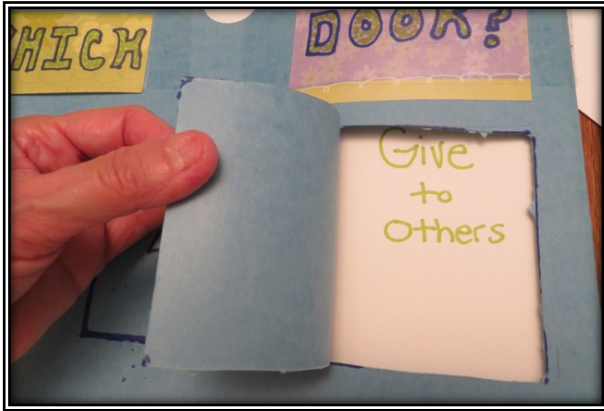


Taking turns between the two teams, they continue to answer review questions while gaining points or giving away points. When the time is up for the game, the surprise comes.

The kids assume that the team with the most points gets the prize or gets to win.

However, they are then informed that this game goes along with a special virtue spoken of in the Bible, the virtue of giving, generosity.

The winning team is the team that gave away the most points because the Bible says it is more blessed to give than to receive.



*Acts 20:35 In all things I have shown you that by working hard in this way we must help the weak and remember the words of the Lord Jesus, how he himself said, 'It is more blessed to give than to receive.'"*

(So you need to have someone quietly keeping track of the points that have been given away.)

The effect that it has on the kids is that one team may be sad because they assume that they did not win. Then they find out that they did win.

In God's economy, the youngest, the smallest, the weakest, the servants are lifted up and are made great in God's kingdom.

In the world, people think that the ones with the most money, the most things, the most intelligence and the favored jobs are the winners.

But God looks on the heart, the humility or the pride and God rewards differently than man rewards.
