# God's Church Expands: The Ministry of Paul Rhyming Reviews for CEF Curriculum

(These reviews coincide with the review questions at the end of each lesson.)

**Instructions:** The purpose for rhyming reviews is to utilize a creative way of restructuring the review questions into rhymes where the class can fill in the answer with a rhyming word. It is an adaption from an old game called "Ralph the Rhymer."

For example: Fill in the rhyming word in this sentence.

God's salvation is for every (nation). Or the victory is won in God's (Son).

Children do much better by answering as a class for the rhyming review. It also gives confidence to those who come close to getting the answer. They are immediately a part of the whole group with the right answer. Some reviews will have a double set of rhyming words.

# **Lesson One: Paul Boldly Tells Others About Jesus**

- 1. When a missionary does his or her job well, all about Jesus to others he or she will tell.
- 2. God chose to help those who follow <u>Jesus</u> by sending His Holy Spirit who will always <u>lead us</u>.
- 3. Before Saul met Jesus, he was on a <u>mission</u> to find every <u>Christian</u>. Why? To put them in <u>jail</u> so they couldn't tell anyone about Jesus.
- 4. What happened to change Paul's <u>mind</u> and his life to be <u>kind</u> to those who follow Jesus? His companions would say, "Just ask us what happened on the way to Damascus."
- 5. What kind of <u>sin</u> would be common to all <u>men</u>? (selfishness, pride, unbelief)
- 6. The missionary who joined Paul would have been liked by <u>all of us</u>. His name was <u>Barnabas</u>. (the encourager)
- 7. There was a false prophet who argued against <u>Paul</u>. For those who wanted to stand strong in their faith, Elymus tried to make them <u>fall</u>.
- 8. What is boldness or might? It is acting with courage to do what is right.
- 9. You can ask God for boldness to tell your family and friends about Jesus this <u>week</u>. Others can pray also with you for the courage you <u>seek</u>.
- 10. What does Gospel <u>mean</u>? It is the good news that Jesus died and rose <u>again</u> to take the payment for our <u>sin</u> and make our hearts <u>clean</u>.
- 11. After the governor heard Paul and Barnabas teach about Jesus, he <u>believed</u> because God's Good News he <u>received</u>.
- 12. Jesus died on a <u>cross</u> to save us who are <u>lost</u>.

#### Lesson Two: God is with Paul and Silas in Prison

- 1. Silas and Timothy joined Paul on his missionary <u>trip</u>. Sometimes they walked. Sometimes they sailed by ship.
- 2. Telling people secrets about their lives is what an evil spirit did through a girl who was a <u>slave</u>. For her masters, a lot of money was <u>made</u>.

- 3. What did Paul command the evil spirit to do? To come out of the girl in the Name of Jesus Christ. Paul and Silas would be paying the price by going to prison.
- 4. The masters were angry that Paul sent the evil spirit <u>away</u>. They threw Paul and Silas in prison for what they did that <u>day</u> because they wanted the evil spirit to <u>stay</u>.
- 5. For those who have trusted in <u>Jesus</u>, God the Holy Spirit is the One who <u>frees us</u> from the fear of hurtful things.
- 6. To open the prison doors for Paul and Silas what did God make? He made the earth to quake.
- 7. Why was the jailor so afraid after God made the earth to <u>quake</u>? When he became <u>awake</u>, he thought the prisoners might escape.
- 8. What did the jailer ask Silas and <u>Paul</u> when he found them <u>all</u>, still in the jail? "Sirs, what must I do to be saved?" Toward himself the sword would no longer be waved.
- 9. Anything that goes against God's <u>law</u>, what would it be <u>called</u>? <u>Sin</u>, and it is found in all people, women and men.
- 10. One of the <u>ways</u> that you can <u>praise</u> is to sing and thank God for what He has <u>done</u>, especially for sending His <u>Son</u>.
- 11. Christ came to <u>save</u>. So he <u>laid</u> down His life for our <u>sin</u> and then came to life <u>again</u>. By believing on <u>Him</u>, He will save you from <u>sin</u>.
- 12. When you are going through a hard and hurtful <u>time</u>, think of this <u>rhyme</u>: Whether you've been through it before or it's all <u>new</u>, don't forget, God's Holy Spirit is always with <u>you</u>.

### **Lesson Three: God Sends Paul to Athens**

- 1. When Paul visited Thessalonica, Berea and Athens, he wanted to tell God's <u>story</u> that the people may give the God of the universe great glory.
- 2. Powerful men of the city decided to cause an uproar and figured what they would <u>do</u>. They gathered a mob so that Paul, Silas and Timothy, they could pursue.
- 3. The people in Athens had a statue called "The Unknown God," just in case they missed <u>one</u> because they didn't know God's <u>Son</u>.
- 4. Someone who loves to think about his own thoughts can make talking about something new into a game. A philosopher would be his name. However, Jesus requires that our talk match our walk.
- 5. Worship is showing our love, thanks and respect for God because of who He is and what He has done. Many worship idols instead of the living God's Son.
- 6. Paul wanted the people of Athens to perceive or <u>see</u>, things about the true God, these <u>three</u>: that God is our Creator, Ruler and <u>Judge</u>. Some believed while some would not <u>budge</u>.

- 7. God has the right to tell us what is right and <u>wrong</u> because He made us, holds the whole universe in His power. To Him we belong.
- 8. How did the philosophers respond after they heard what Paul <u>said</u>? Some made fun of him, and some went ahead, wanting to wait and see. While others wanted to believe.
- 9. No matter how hard we <u>try</u>, we can't be good enough. So Jesus came to <u>die</u> to take the punishment for our sin.
- 10. In the Old Testament it was foretold. Then it happened just as God <u>said</u>, after Jesus died, he arose from the dead.
- 11. To be saved from sin, like all men, we need to believe in Jesus whom God did send.
- 12. Quote Romans 1:16 to remember the power of God for <u>salvation</u> that is for every <u>nation</u>.

## **Lesson Four: God Keeps His Promise to Paul**

- 1. Where was God sending <u>Paul</u> who used to be called, <u>Saul</u>? To Rome it <u>was</u> and that's because God said Paul was to be a witness there for Him.
- 2. Paul was a prisoner because he did quite <u>well</u> when he went to <u>tell</u> people about <u>Jesus</u>. Then many Jews said, "This does not please us."
- 3. Paul drew near when Jesus appeared, to tell him that he would go to Rome.
- 4. The sailors threw most everything overboard with all their might to make the ship more light.
- 5. Is it possible for God, a promise to <u>break?</u> No, for His Name's <u>sake</u>, because He is faithful and <u>true</u>. Breaking a promise He would never <u>do</u>.
- 6. Where can God's children find His promises <u>true</u>? In His Word, the Bible, a special message for you.
- 7. How long was the <u>storm</u> when the ship was tossed and <u>torn</u>? 14 days when everyone on board began to think the ship will surely sink.
- 8. Yes, the storm they all <u>braved</u> and 276 lives were <u>saved</u>.
- 9. After the storm, the ship was a <u>mess</u>, all broken up, but the people, God did <u>bless</u>. All were saved. Paul would go to Rome. Did God keep His promise? Yes!
- 10. People think of so many ways to become a child of God. But there is really only <u>one</u> and that is through His <u>Son</u>.
- 11. So we can become a part of God's family, Jesus took the punishment for our <u>sin</u>, then died and came back to life <u>again</u>.
- 12. To become a child of God, we must on the Lord Jesus <u>believe</u>, then His life eternal we will <u>receive</u>.

Lesson Five: Paul Encourages Believers to Stand Firm

- 1. When <u>Paul</u>, who used to be <u>Saul</u>, wrote the book of Ephesians, he could not <u>roam</u> for he was a prisoner in a city called Rome.
- 2. When Paul wrote the letter to the <u>Ephesians</u>, he was in a Roman prison and couldn't go <u>see</u> them.
- 3. What can hurt you most in life so that you cannot win? That would be sin.
- 4. For sure footing, Roman soldiers wore shoes. One for each foot, they come in two's.
- 5. God's true Word is the best protection from Satan's <u>lie</u>. The proof is in believing and in obeying. That, no one can deny.
- 6. Around his waist, the Roman soldier wore a belt or chord, and in his hand he carried a sword.
- 7. Our weapon for spiritual warfare is not a physical sword as it would <u>seem</u>. But the truth of God's Word that cuts into Satan's every <u>scheme</u>. Like putting on a soft <u>glove</u>, that truth must be spoken in <u>love</u>.
- 8. Being strong in the Lord and in the power of His <u>might</u> means that God gives you the strength to do what is right.
- 9. What would the child of God, dressed in God's armor, standing firm, be <u>saying</u>? He or she would be talking with God. That's called, praying.
- 10. Wanting to do something that goes against God is called <u>temptation</u>. It is known by every boy and girl who are from every <u>nation</u>.
- 11. When we believe on Jesus God's Spirit will lead us to be strong in Jesus:
  - To stand firm, the truth confirm
  - To do what is right because God is with us day and night.
  - God is for us, knowing what is best,
  - We know God's Bible answer will pass the test.
  - In Jesus we are strong. To God we belong.
- 12. Quote Ephesians 6:10 to encourage the people of God, among all women and all men.
