

Jesus God of Power and Glory

Rhyming Reviews for CEF Curriculum

(These reviews coincide with the review questions at the end of each lesson.)

Instructions: The purpose for rhyming reviews is to utilize a creative way of restructuring the review questions into rhymes where the class can fill in the answer with a rhyming word. It is an adaption from an old game called “Ralph the Rhymer.”

For example: Fill in the rhyming word in this sentence.

God’s salvation is for every (nation). Or the victory is won in God’s (Son).

Children do much better by answering as a class for the rhyming review. It also gives confidence to those who come close to getting the answer. They are immediately a part of the whole group with the right answer. Some reviews will have a double set of rhyming words.

Lesson One: Jesus Teaches with Power

1. What do we learn about God when we hear His story? He has all power and glory.
2. God knows all about us because He perfectly knows and sees us. God teaches us about Himself through the Bible and through Jesus.
3. Jesus is the perfect one to teach about God to men because He is 100% God and 100% human.
4. When people heard Jesus claim to be God they became angry, one day. He must be lying is all they could say.
5. God created everything both small and large. He knows how it’s made and how it works; so He’s in charge.
6. Breaking God’s rules is common to all children, women and men. It’s a little word with big problems, called sin.
7. What does the Bible say? Believing in Jesus is the only way for people to be with God.
8. What happened after Jesus died for our sin? He came back to life again.
9. How long did Jesus teach and preach among His peers? About three years.
10. To learn more about David’s songs we might read a Psalms. To learn about what Jesus taught we would read from Matthew, Mark, Luke or John.
11. When people heard Jesus teach with great power and authority they were somewhat dazed and really amazed.
12. When people are afraid they might cower. But Jesus spoke with authority, meaning with all knowledge and power.

Lesson Two: Jesus Calms a Terrible Storm

1. Jesus and His disciples were in a boat crossing a sea. What would the name of the sea be?
None but the Sea of Galilee!
2. The wind howled and the waves crashed on the little boat. The water was much too deep to wade. The disciples panicked. They were so afraid.
3. When storms in our lives come crashing in, *IN* Jesus we can place our trust. To survive the storm, it is a must.
4. In the storm, the disciples feared the worst. The control of the boat they could not keep. Yet, Jesus, full of peace was fast asleep.
5. When we are tempted to be afraid, we don't have to get all flighty. We can place our trust in Jesus because He is God almighty.
6. Because Jesus is God of the universe, it will obey He will. Jesus proved that when He commanded the storm to be still. (And it did.)
7. The disciples were amazed, some were afraid and they wondered who Jesus really is. It was like their hearts were torn when Jesus calmed the storm.
8. Jesus had power to calm the storm because He is God. If you believe this is true, please nod.
9. Through the storm, the disciples, Jesus was teaching. They found out they could trust Him. It was their *hearts* He was reaching.
10. How can we be the ones Jesus is teaching and reaching? By listening to and obeying His Word. Of His plan and His glory we will be assured.
11. What does it mean to believe on God's Son? It means to place our trust in Jesus, who on the cross took away our sin and came back to life to free us.
12. In our lives, if we want God's will to be done, we must listen to and follow His Son.

Lesson Three: Jesus Feeds a Huge Crowd

1. To hear Jesus teaching 5,000 people came. They brought the sick and the lame.
2. The people were hungry. So Jesus told the disciples to have them take a seat. Jesus was going to give them some bread and fish to eat.
3. What a tasty dish! Jesus thanked God the Father first, for the 5 loaves and two fish.
4. How could they feed 5,000 with 5 loaves and two fish? The disciples needed to listen to Jesus and do what He said. Next, they needed to begin passing out the bread.
5. The people had a lot to say about the 12 baskets of food that was left over that day.
6. The people decided that Jesus should be king and for them every day, that bread to bring.
7. Yet Jesus, came to give them the *Bread of Life* and save them from their sin. This would be for all women, children and men.
8. What did Jesus say? He is the only way!
9. When Jesus spoke the truth that people didn't want to hear, they simply stopped drawing near.
10. When Jesus asked the disciples if they would stop following Him like the others, Peter answered with a question: "To whom shall we go? You are the Son of the living God. This we believe and know."
11. Like Peter, have you come to believe and know, that for forgiveness of sin, to Jesus you must go?
12. For all that we need, do you remember what Jesus said? "Pray in this way: Give us this day our daily bread."

Lesson Four: Jesus Offers Hope to a Samaritan Leper

1. If a Jew saw a Samaritan on any given day, not knowing that God cared for them they would do all that they could to stay away.
2. If a person with leprosy would be seen, they had to warn everyone and shout, "Unclean!"
3. If you believe sin is going against God, show me by giving a nod.
4. We are part of all that God did make. Unique in His image for God's own sake.
5. God made us different from each other, with all colors and shapes and sizes for each sister and each brother.
6. The number of lepers that came to Jesus was ten. By the power of God he healed all ten men.
7. They all ran off so excited. Then back came one to than God's Son.

8. Where is Jesus? In heaven where He sees us and hears our every prayer.
9. What can you thank God for today? To show your gratitude, what will your words say?
10. To call on the name of the Lord, what does it mean? But to trust Jesus completely, from sin to make us clean.
11. If someone gives you a soda, you can thank them in Hebrew by saying, "Toda!"
12. Just quote the verse, Matthew 6:12, to find out we don't need a doctor or a nurse.
Forgiveness is what we need for our debt of sin.

Lesson Five: Jesus Explains His Amazing Plan

1. To hear Peter's answer when Jesus asked him who He was, was so nice. He said, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God."
2. Let me see you nod if you believe Jesus is the one true God.
3. What is God's plan to save people from their sin? What does the Bible say? Jesus would suffer, die and be raised from the dead on the third day.
4. Three disciples when up to the mountain with Jesus. What were their names? Peter, John and James.
5. Peter, James and John saw Jesus face and clothes brightly shine. It was a very special time.
6. The three disciples saw Jesus' shining glory. Sometime later they would share this story.
7. To the three disciples it was clear. Jesus spoke with Moses and Elijah when they appeared.
8. What did Jesus do to save us from sin, we who are lost? He died on the cross.
9. The disciples were really "wowed" when they saw the bright cloud and heard God the Father speak out loud to them.
10. Today can you say the word up? Jesus is the one true God. It is true always!
11. When God's Word we hear, it must be made clear, to obey it and keep it near.
12. Jesus gave us an example for prayer so that we can know how to pray. When talking with God this is what we can say: Quote Matthew 6:9-13
